Liberty Adult Education is excited to announce the addition of the Career Connections Employment Readiness and College Transition Help Center.

The Career Connections Employment Readiness and College Transition Center opened in September at Liberty Adult Education. It is open to all students who attend Liberty Adult Education. The Career Center is for Employment Readiness training and College Transition information and all other career-focused help at No Charge to students.

The Career Center is located on the Liberty Adult Campus in Room 17 with workshops and open hours throughout the week.

There is an on-staff Employment Specialist who can help students learn how to job search, and help with resumes and interview skills. There are workshops, a Certificate Program and the Employment Specialist will work with you one-on-one for any of your vocational coaching or employment readiness training needs.

All workshops, materials, one-on-one appointments with staff professionals are FREE to students.

In the College Transition area there is a College Transition Specialist who can help to guide you from your adult education goals to future college career goals. There is information about the types of programs offered at the local community colleges. Students can make one-on-one appointments with the Transition Specialist for information and advice on how to proceed to the next step in your college pursuits.

What will you find in the Career Connections Center?

- There is a **“Job Board”** with new employment positions added daily.
- There is a **“What’s New in Today’s Work News”** that is filled with information on the news of employment preparation changes.
- A **“Current Events”** section with information on Job Fairs and On-site Hiring Events that are happening in our area with daily updates.
- A bounty of **“College Program Brochures”** that can offer insight into a career field of interest or pursuit.
- And of course, **“What to Wear?”** There is a **“Professional Dress”** section that show men and women what to wear to a job interview, or a job fair. Students can create their own **“Professional Brand”** for an early start in budget planning a professional wardrobe.
